Cadbury Fun Recipes

Cadbury Milk Chocolate Popcorn

12 cups popcorn, popped
1/4 cup butter
2 1/2 cups salted peanuts
2 cups Cadbury Chocolate Chips
1 cup corn syrup

- 1) Preheat oven to 150°C.
- 2) In large greased roasting pan, combine popcorn and nuts.
- 3) In large heavy saucepan, combine chocolate chips, corn syrup and butter.
- 4) Cook over medium heat until mixture boils, stirring constantly. Pour 5) over popcorn.
- 6) Toss well to coat.
- 7) Bake 45 minutes, stirring frequently.
- 8) Cool.
- 9) Store in an airtight container for up to two weeks.

Marshmallow Chocolate Crunch

1 cup Cadbury Chocolate Chips
1/4 cup peanut butter
3 cups Ricies Cereal
1 cup marshmallows

- 1) Melt chips and peanut butter together in large saucepan, stirring until smooth.
- 2) Remove from heat.
- 3) Add cereal and marshmallows.
- 4) Mix well.
- 5) Press mixture into buttered 8-inch square pan.
- 6) Chill until firm.

Easy As Chocolate Fudge

2 2/3 cups Cadbury Chocolate Chips
1 tsp. vanilla
1 can sweetened condensed milk

- 1) In microwave safe bowl, add milk and chocolate chips.
- 2) Cook until melted.
- 3) Add vanilla, stir well.
- 4) Place mixture in heavily buttered 8x8 inch square pan.
- 5) Chill.

Super Chocolate Chip Marshmallow Fudge

1 1/2 cups sugar
3/4 cup evaporated milk
2 1/4 cups Cadbury Chocolate Chips
1 1/2 cups Pascall Marshmallows (or more if you are a wee bit greedy)
1 1/2 Tbsps. butter
3/4 cup walnuts coarsely chopped or pecans

- 1) In saucepan, cook and stir sugar and milk, over medium heat,
- 2) until mixture comes to a full boil.
- 3) Boil for 5 minutes, stirring constantly.
- 4) Remove from heat.
- 5) Stir in chocolate chips, marshmallows and butter until marshmallows are melted and no white streaks remain.
- 7) Stir in chopped nuts.
- 8) Immediately spread in an 8 inch square baking pan.
- 9) Chill 1 hour.

Firstly I would like to thank the Club for inviting me to judge at the show. I always take it as an honour to judge my breed and I know the hard work that goes into preparing them for the show.

I would like to thank the exhibitors for the manner in which they accepted my decisions.

Overall I saw some lovely heads and type but there is room for improvement. I feel that if we want to have our breed judged as a working dog we should make sure they are fit and muscled. I saw a couple of bites that concerned me so keep an eye on these. I was pleased to find nearly all the dogs had correct feet.

Unfortunately many of the bitches were not in good coat and I felt the dogs overall were better than the bitches and as the bitches are the strength of the breed it was a little bit disappointing. I know that the breeders in New Zealand are working hard and bringing in new lines so that is a very positive outlook for the breeds' future.

Good type, nice head and expression. Correct feet and good bone, would prefer a little more neck.

Showing his age. Good size, correct feet and good bone.

A little large for me but another lovely veteran.

Up to size, very masculine dog with a lovely outline. Pleasing head and expression. Good reach of neck which gave elegance to his strength. Not in full coat but of good quality. Correct feet and good bone, moved true. CC and best in show.

2. Aust Ch Anaky Its Party time (Imp Aust)

Good type and outline. In good correct coat. Pleasing head and expression, moved well but I would like a little more length of leg.

3. NZ/Aust/Sgpore Ch Kimchatka the Real Mccoy

A smaller dog. Compact outline. Pleasing head and expression, good bone. Did not move as well as I would have liked due to being compact in the body.

Baby puppy bitch (3)**1. Samloch Sunlit Silvamist (Imp Aust)** 4 months

A real little showgirl. Pretty head and expression. Good reach of neck. Good eye and ear. Lovely outline. Moved like a little trooper. Would prefer just a little more substance but she is only a baby.

2. Kamera Gleaming star at Amarak 5 months

Another nice baby, nice head and expression but a slightly bigger ear and a little longer in loin. Good tail. Moved and showed well.

3. Kelljass Imperial Lace Nearly 6 months

Going through the gangly stage moved OK would like to see the tail settle.

Puppy Bitch**1. Kalaska Wild Excitement at Oscarbi (Imp Aust)**

Well developed young lady, very well presented. Nice head and expression. Good thick coat. Good bone moved well and showed well.

2. Sunshine Paint me Suzanna

Another nice puppy. Nice head and expression. Good bone and feet. Moved well.

Junior Bitch**1. Kelljass Antique Chyna Doll**

Good head and expression. Correct front angulation. Correct feet. Moved well.

Not much to separate 1 & 2 Good outline also had lovely feet, moved well just preferred front on first bitch.



Close call with Roosay



A few months back we nearly lost Roosay to stomach torsion. Roosay is 13 years old so not the young bitch some of you may remember. She ate her tea as normal and then straight after finishing went outside. Once outside she started crying in pain, biting her stomach, and trying to toilet. She went from being a happy dog to a one in great pain within minutes. Fortunately I had heard the story about someone else's dog that had got bloat and I was worried it may be the same thing so Roosay was quickly bundled up

in the car and taken to the emergency vet.

Even though Roosay was at the emergency vet very quickly it took some time once we got her there to confirm the stomach torsion. The initial thinking by the vet was that she had pancreatitis. As Roosay is not fed dry food her stomach did not blow up like a drum, which is the classic sign of torsion the vet had been used to seeing. She also failed the other sign the vet was used to seeing - gas bubbling out when her stomach was stabbed. The only thing that supported my thinking that it was bloat was that when the vet tried to empty her stomach she could not get the rubber tube into Roosay's stomach. The other possibility was that she had something stuck in her throat.



Fortunately given the uncertainty about what was wrong with Roosay the vet decided to prepare her for surgery and Roosay was put on support drugs and morphine. Despite the morphine she remained in pain even when the level was ramped up. After an x-ray it was very clear her stomach was being to extend and she needed to be opened up to try and save her life there and then.

Even though Roosay is an old granny she is very healthy and survived the operation. It was a very worrying and sleepless night. In the morning she was transferred to her normal vet. When the vet operated she sewed Roosay's stomach to the side wall to prevent any further twisting. At the vets she recovered quickly in the first few days but unfortunately when she was taken off the pain relief and support drugs she went downhill very fast and we thought once again we were going to lose her. After being back on the drugs again for a few days she was taken off them again. It is important to get the stomach working again as quickly as possible.

The second time she was much stronger and after a few more nights at the vet finally got to come home. Roosay was at the vets for a full week and really pleased to come home. Once home she just slept and slept. I actually think she was very depressed at the vets so getting her home was important to her ongoing recovery. All the vets were great and so pleased that Roosay pulled thru as they had a dog in with the same thing the week

before that had not recovered. Roosay had to have regular checks up for the next month as the toxins can build up and cause a massive heart attack within this period. Roosay is now back to her old self the only tell tale sign being her Poodle appearance. She had her front legs and all of her tummy shaved.

So if your dog ever suddenly gets pain in its stomach please take it to the vet ASAP. The vet said if we had left taking Roosay to the vet in the morning she would have definitely died.

WHAT TO DO IN AN EMERGENCY!

Check your dog's mucus membrane colour (gums, inside cheeks). They should be light pink, moist and when pressed on return to their original colour unless then 2 seconds. If they are pale, white, blue or yellow and do not return to that colour within 2 secs then veterinary attention is required

Vital Statistics: Pulse and Heart Rate

Normal resting rates:

Small dogs: 90-120 bpm

Medium dogs: 70-110 bpm

Large dogs: 60-90 bpm

Pulse should be strong, regular and easy to locate.

Checking the pulse

The easiest place to locate a pulse is the femoral artery in the groin area. Place your fingers on the inside of the hind leg and slide your hand upward until the back of your fingers touches the abdomen. Gently move your fingers back and forth on the inside of the hind leg until you feel the pulsing blood. Count the number of pulses in 15 seconds and multiply that number by 4. This will give you the beats per minute (bpm).

Temperature

Normal temp. for dogs: 37.8 - 39.1 deg C (100-102.5 deg F)

Thermometer should be almost clean when removed.

Abnormalities are indicated by blood, diarrhoea, or black, tarry stool.

Basic First Aid Procedures

All of the following situations require immediate veterinary care:

For Fractures

Muzzle animal.

Gently lay animal on a board, wooden door, tarp, etc. padded with blankets.

Secure animal to the support.

Do not attempt to set the fracture.

If a limb is broken, wrap the leg in cotton padding, then wrap with a magazine, rolled newspaper, towel or two sticks. Splint should extend one joint above the fracture and one joint below. Secure with tape. Make sure wrap does not constrict blood flow.

If the spine, ribs, hip, etc. appears injured or broken, gently place the animal on the stretcher and immobilize it if possible.


If Bleeding (external)

If an open wound is bleeding, the first priority is to control it. Before attempting to do anything, be sure the animal is properly restrained and, if necessary, apply a muzzle. To stop bleeding, apply direct pressure to the wound using a sterile or clean gauze sponge or cloth. When applying pressure, do not

keep lifting the gauze to see if the bleeding has



stopped. This only disrupts the clot that may have formed. Likewise, if blood soaks through the gauze, do not discard the soaked bandage since it contains important clotting factors. Instead, keep adding more



bandage material on top of the soaked bandage. If possible, elevate the wound.

For severe bleeding, it may be necessary to apply direct pressure to the arteries that supply the affected area. These pressure points are located at the upper inside (armpit) of the front legs, the upper inside of the hind legs and the underside of the tail. The use of a tourniquet should be avoided. However, if a tourniquet is to be used, it must be used only as a last resort and then only if it is loosened every few minutes to restore blood circulation.

Muzzle animal.

Press thick gauze pad over wound. Hold firmly until clotting occurs.

If bleeding is severe, apply a tourniquet between the wound and the heart. Loosen tourniquet for 20 seconds every 15-20 minutes. A tourniquet is dangerous and should only be used in life-threatening haemorrhaging of a limb. It may result in amputation or disability of the limb.

If Bleeding (internal)

Symptoms: bleeding from nose, mouth, rectum; coughing blood; blood in urine; pale gums; collapse; rapid or weak pulse.

Keep animal as warm and quiet as possible.

Burns

Chemical

Muzzle animal.

Flush immediately with large quantities of cold water.

Severe

Muzzle animal.

Quickly apply ice water compresses.

Treat or shock if necessary.

Shock

Symptoms: weak pulse; shallow breathing; nervousness; dazed appearance. Often accompanies severe injury or extreme fright. Keep animal restrained, quiet and warm. If unconscious, keep head level with rest of body.

Restraint Methods

If your animal is injured, you must restrain him/her for your safety as well as your pet's. Muzzle your pet to restrain it unless it is unconscious, has difficulty breathing or has a mouth injury.

Dogs - Muzzles

Speak and move calmly and quietly.

Have someone restrain the dog with a leash.

Approach dog from the side and behind its head; do not attempt to put muzzle on from the front. Quickly slip a nylon or wire cage muzzle over nose, secure snugly behind ears.

If a muzzle is not available, you can make one from a strip of gauze, rag, necktie, belt or rope about 3 feet long. Make a large loop in the centre. Quickly slip loop over dog's nose. Bring ends under chin. Tie snugly behind ears.

Prevent wound contamination

A clean, protective dressing should be applied to open wounds whenever possible to prevent infection and contamination. Never use cotton batting directly on an open wound, since the fibres will contaminate the wound.

If the wound is minor and superficial, gently cleanse it with ordinary soap and water. Try to clip back the hairs with a pair of scissors, being careful not to cut the skin accidentally. Apply an antiseptic or antibiotic ointment, followed by a snug dressing. Be careful not to restrict the circulation by making the bandage too tight. If a wound is major and deep, do not probe or clean it, but simply apply a dressing and contact your veterinarian. As a rule, cats and dogs do not require tetanus shots.

For bite wounds, clip back the hairs away from the puncture sites with scissors and then thoroughly wash the wound with copious amounts of soap and water. Three per cent hydrogen peroxide may also be used after washing.

It is wise to have all bite wounds examined by a veterinarian, no matter how minor they appear. Very often, there may be more extensive damage to the tissues under the skin that is not immediately evident. Most, if not all, pets with open wounds and bite wounds also require antibiotics to prevent infection.
