THE RACING SAMS...

But where do I start?

I have decided to start at the beginning of this year.

In early Jan Mac, Fred, Seb, Luke and I found a nice little place, just outside of Foxton, that would suit our needs for a couple more years. There were nearly 1000 acres that we could use for training (as long as the cows weren't in the way). Unfortunately it doesn't snow around here... but beggars cannot be choosers.

We have a gravel road outside our gate, this is great for letting the boys out on and toughening up their feet, as the rest of the place is mainly sand and grass, the farm's races are wide and sometimes shitty... lol. But that doesn't seem to bother the boys, they are keen to catch the next rabbit that they flush out.

This year Luke and I have gotten in to more motor bike racing (or, in my case motor bike crashing) and so the dog racing has not been as full on as previous years, but that is not to say that we haven't done any training, the longest run we had was just a little over 8ks, some of you will remember that years gone by we have done up to 20ks in a single training run, but

I was targeting a different type of race then, also I had the use of 4 young dogs. Mac is getting on a bit now, I think he is 10/11 (Lynne will correct me there) and he cannot keep up with Fred and Seb any more... BUT he can still do the distances I ask of him, which is around 3-5ks per run. I free run him so he sets his own pace. He tends to arrive home no more than a couple of minutes behind the rest of us. I am always waiting at the gate for him. Even though they are white, sometimes at night you can only see him within the last 50 or so meters from home, so I really have to use my eyes..... A torch? What the hell is that? Hahahahaha

The first race we went to this year was at the Wiatereri forest - the temp was around 7deg (I think) and I only took Fred and Seb as there were no veteran races, and those of you who know Mac..... well he barks a bit.

We came last.

But we had a lot of fun. I wore my new gumboots as it was raining a LOT, and there were BIG puddles and when I finished I had BROWN dogs

Why did we come last?... well we had only done 2 training runs beforehand. The weather around here had been too warm (over 10 deg.) to even think about a run..

But that soon changed, the grass turned white and the boys were jumping out of their skin to go out... we are lucky here, as most times the paddock next to us is empty of stock... but it is home to a few rabbits, and the dogs know this, so on really cold mornings, all I have to do is open the gate and there are 3 white blurs running off into the distance, there are small hills and trees for them to race around (Luke has made a M/X track here also) the rabbits disappear

into thin air, but that does not stop the boys from thinking that they are still there, and when it is time for them to come home, I just call them back. Sometimes I take them into the next paddock, but not often.

We have been training up for a 2 heat race at a winery in Hastings. The length is around 5ks, one heat Saturday morn and the other on Saturday night. Would the boys recover well enough? We were also in the freight class, just to add to the workload.

Mac was in the vet with Luke being the musher.

He came last - but his tail was still wagging!!! (we latter found out the reason he was last, another dog decided to have "a go" at the blond as Mac OVERTOOK her. There was a bit of hair pulling as Mac and Luke tried to get away, they did and Mac did as he was told and to carry on, Mac did NOT retaliate OR start it... he was a good boy but it put him off his game for the rest of the day)

Fred and Seb on the other hand... we went well. In the first race I managed to overtake a couple of Mal's !!! The team ahead of them were also Mal's and then there was a team of cross breeds, not sure what make. We couldn't catch the next team and we came 3rd in the first heat beaten by just over 1 minute by the second place getter.

I had fed the boys the day before at lunch time. This meant that they had nearly an empty stomach by the end of the first heat and were really hungry... great plan ... if they would eat that is... when I came to feed them after the first heat they were not interested (yes I had waited an hr afterwards.) so they finally got fed around 2 hrs before the next race. Bugger, I

thought (it was fatty chicken necks ,,,,mmmm) that may have hindered their race. But NO, the boys raced away, catching up to the second place, getter and even overtaking them... for a bit, the Mals, they are a strong powerful breed, and my guys just didn't have the power to pull away for long, the Mals just keep the same speed as us. When we speed up, so did they, but when they sped up, Fred got really going, he even at one stage pulled me, the freight AND Seb and over took them again... what a dog!!! We were neck and neck for around 2ks the musher and I were having a good old chat. Unfortunately on the last corner, just as I said to Fred "LETS GO" (this makes the boys speed up for around 20m) one of the Mals finally had, had enough of the blonds and decided to pull some of Fred's hair. Poor old Fred, I jumped in and tried to separate them. Seb was doing his best to stay out of it, but they were joined at the collar by a 5" neck line.... Finally I got them separated, and Fred and Seb were out of there, I JUST managed to jump on the rig as it flew past. We crossed the finish line seconds later. Everyone was concerned with Fred, but there was NO blood, only a bit of hair loss. And a pissed off Fred but nothing more. When we got back to the van, I noticed blood on my hand... yep I was the only one bitten, I had 3 nice big holes in my wrist, the teeth had missed all the important bits, so off to the doc and ... take 2 tablets and see ya in the morning (actually he gave me some strong penicillin tablets I had to take for a week). I found out a week latter that we had come in SECOND (combined total times from both heats) by 20sec.!!

After that race I purposely left it a week before the next training run, this time I harnessed up the dogs and attached them to a quad bike... there lies a couple of other funny stories.....



ATTENTION ALL DOGS!!!

THE FOLLOWING ARE IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR EVERY DOG TO KNOW

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PROPERLY HUGGING A BABY
